Welcome	<p>Dear students, We are pleased that you wish to study at the Faculty of Architecture of the Brno University of Technology. We look forward to welcome you in Brno. Below you will find some useful information to get ready for your student mobility exchange.</p>
Application	<p>Fill in the online Application for short-term study and Learning Agreement at https://www.vut.cz/eprhlaska/en/z/zadani/vybrat-fakultu. After the final approval of the Learning Agreement on our part, print out the Application Protocol and Learning Agreement, have the documents confirmed by your home-institution coordinator and send the documents to us by e-mail to havlovad@vut.cz together with your Transcript of Records and English language certificate (at least B1 level). Please, do not forget to include your passport-size photograph in jpg.</p> <p>The recommended number of ECTS credits per semester is 30, please discuss the details with your home institution coordinator before selecting the courses in the learning agreement.</p> <p>Application deadline:</p> <p>31 May – for studies starting in September (e-application is open since March 31) 30 April – for students who need visa to enter the Czech Republic 15 November – for studies starting in February (e-application is open since September 15) 15 October – for students who need visa to enter the Czech Republic</p>
Calendar	<p>Winter semester lasts from 13 September 2021 till 17 December 2021, followed by a Christmas break and exam period till 4 February 2022. Summer semester lasts from 14 February 2022 till 20 May 2022, followed by exam period till 24 June 2022</p> <p>The international students are welcome to participate in the Welcome Week that starts a week before the start of each semester and is organized by the International Relations Department and Erasmus Student Network of the Brno University of Technology. Welcome Week includes 5 days of intensive course in Czech (from Monday to Friday) at a language school and 2-day orientation weekend. The whole programme is provided free of charge for incoming students. For more information see https://www.esncz.org/</p>
Courses	<p>The courses for international students are offered in English language. For information on the courses available see LIST OF COURSES FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS</p>
Language requirements and language courses	<p>Applicants who want to be admitted to the study programme in English must have a good knowledge of written and spoken English. With the exception of a native speaker, all applicants must prove the knowledge of at least B1 level with an English language certificate.</p> <p>The Faculty of Architecture does not provide any language courses. Students who want to learn Czech may follow the Czech Language Course for Foreigners organized by the Faculty of Civil Engineering of the Brno University of Technology. The course is provided free of charge for a limited number of incoming students.</p>
Accommodation	<p>BUT provides good-class accommodation in modern halls of residence, mostly in double rooms with a bathroom, a kitchenette, a Wi-Fi. Students can use the laundry rooms for minimum price. Foreign students are accommodated at halls of residence Pod Palackého vrchem at Kolejní street near the main university campus. There are many facilities available for students: fitness centre, gym, boulder centre, cinema, student club, bar, snack bar, post office etc. Students can also use a computer room, which is linked to the Internet. On the premises there are also a shop, a library, a copy-centre, a CD</p>

	<p>lending office. A shop is supplied with groceries, stationery and drugstore goods.</p> <p>Complete information regarding accommodation can be found at: http://www.skm.vut.cz/Angl/Default.asp. It is necessary to book a room by a student before his arrival through internet at: https://www.kam.vut.cz/english/Default.aspx?p=SocratesKon&t=st. The online request for accommodation is open from April 1, 2021 for the first semester and full year incoming students, and from September 1, 2021 for the second semester incoming students.</p>
Visa	<p>According to the law all EU nationals need no visa to study in the Czech Republic. Non-EU visiting students can get information about visa application procedure at the Czech embassy or consulate in their home country or can see the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic - http://www.mzv.cz. (Do submit your e-application as soon as possible to be able to apply for the visa in time.)</p>
Health Insurance	<p>To obtain treatment under the provisions of the European regulation, EU students can go to the doctor/dentist/hospital directly with the E111 or European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or it is possible to choose and contact one of the health insurance funds (HIF), where the Certificate of registration will be obtained.</p> <p>All non-EU visiting students must be medically insured. It is a precondition of the visa application process.</p>
